### **CALL TO ORDER**

Chair, Gunta Vitins, called the meeting to order at 9:10am.

The Chair acknowledged that the meeting was held on the traditional and unceded territories of the Kwantlen, Sto:lo, and Lummi First Nations.

#### **ADOPTION OF AGENDA**

### 1.0 INDUSTRY VISION 2023

BCEMB is in the process of creating a 2023 industry vision with a complementing operational roadmap that can be used by BCEMB as a tool to develop, execute, and defend both current and future programming to stakeholders. The intention is to develop key operational objectives and develop programming that will support the Board to execute the strategic vision.

The Board agreed with the proposed goals with the amendments that the average farm size by production type be included to further assist in programming and that production by region be reviewed once the Nielsen Regionality Study results are received.

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### 2.0 NEW PRODUCER PROGRAM

BCEMB is amid a review of the effectiveness and process of its New Producer Program to establish if there is an opportunity for the BCEMB to, while maintaining its accountability to all stakeholders and adherence to the SAFETI principles, change and improve the policies that surround incentive quotas issued under the New Producer Program set forward in Part IV of our Consolidated Orders.

The Board agreed with Staff's recommended objectives for the programs with the amendment that the program is not meant to ensure that a new entrant has a self-sufficient business operation that provides for one full-time equivalent salary. The Board also discussed options for addressing regional requirements, updating the program requirements to attract participants who will be invested in the industry long term, and a quota lease component for new entrants.

The Board discussed options for the program that consider market responsiveness, regional efficiency, grader input, and the ability to be flexible and fluid to match the current needs. The concepts will be reviewed further at the January 21<sup>st</sup> meeting.

#### 3.0 QUOTA ALLOCATION METHOD

EFC has ratified a National Quota Allocation of 27,432,857 layers, which represents an additional 1,443,475 layers for the country and 202,110 additional layers for BC, representing a 6.48% increase in quota for the province. BC Egg must now determine an allocation methodology that meets the Regulated Markets Economic Policy and SAFETI Principles, and addresses the issues raised by BCFIRB

The Board reviewed the allocation method options to determine a concept that will meet the requirements and benefit the future of the industry. It was deemed important to create a plan that will produce a favorable outcome for the industry, promote animal welfare, support producers who are actively engaged, and encourage transition away from conventional production. The Board also discussed amending parameters for receiving quota and leasing facilities.

The intent for this allocation method is to create a three-year plan to provide producers and BC FIRB with a direction that would be reviewed yearly, with the intent of receiving approval one year in advance of growth. Each year BC Egg would also conduct a review of the previous allocation to ensure the method and outcomes still meet with the objectives and criteria set forward by the Board.
